




Reinventing Careers: A Shifting Mindset Reflects a Growing Concern by Senior Master Sgt. David Betts — <u>David.betts.1@ang.af.mil</u> 187th Fighter Wing Human Resource Advisor — 334.394.7178

There are many changes that occur over our military career. Some are our decisions and many others are not. Due to a smaller portion of the population meeting the military entrance requirements and a shift in demographics within the population, we are at the point of taking additional

talent searching methods to recruit and retain an effective Air National Guard. The effort reaches beyond the 187th Fighter Wing.

According to the "Pentagon's quiet push for military personnel reform," an article by Andrew Tilghman, a Staff writer with the Air Force Times (May 18-25 2015)- "the shifting mindset reflects a growing concern that the military's traditional personnel system, essentially static for decades, is falling behind the freewheeling and technology-driven practices of the private sector. That, in turn, is sparking anxiety that a serious recruitment and retention crisis may loom on the horizon.

"This is a moment that calls for revolutionary change in the human resources practice of DoD," wrote Brad Carson, Acting Undersecretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness, in a recent memo obtained by Military Times.

Unless the "calcified personnel system, largely unchanged since 1947," gets a radical update soon, "we will increasingly bleed key talent to the private sector, for which words like flexibility and agility are more than slogans," Carson writes in the four-page memo to Defense Secretary Ash Carter, dated April 20."

Many things are in consideration, such as: giving individual troops and unit-level commanders more control over job assignments, allowing for flexibility to transfer between active and reserve components, building customizable civilian paths to military service, revamping the promotion system to place less weight on time-in-grade and more on merit, skills and performance along with creating a portable 401(k)-style retirement system.

The 187 FW goals are to secure the F-35 and to ensure that ACC has good access to "our iron." Our three priorities for accomplishing these goals are:

- <u>Recruiting:</u> Col. Efferson, 187th Fighter Wing commander, states "This is the #1 priority. Be
 positive when talking to potential recruits visiting your shop. There is a lot of hard work to be
 done out here, but we all need to be excited and enthusiastic about what we do!" We haven't
 reached our recruiting goal.
- <u>Total Force Integration (TFI):</u> We are fortunate to be one of only four Air National Guard units selected for this type of mission. There will be more than 30 active duty personnel assigned by the end of September.
- Successfully Accomplishing the Future Mission: We still have to accomplish the current mission. Proper execution of the current mission will ensure we are prepared for the future mission. Our Air Force Inspection System (AFIS/ Air Force Instruction 90-201) inspection is February 2016.

MEMORIAL DAY CEREMONY

Honoring six fallen unit members

In observance of Memorial Day, 187th Fighter Wing members, along with veterans and family, took a moment to pay respect to six unit members who died in the past year. The ceremony was held in Memorial Park at Dannelly Field Air National Guard Base.

During the memorial, several military customs were observed, to include the posting of the colors, singing of the National Anthem by Alabama Air National Guard Staff Sgt. Adrienne Barron, a moment of silence and the playing of "Taps."

Senior Airman Uriel Padilla, a member of the Detachment 100, part of the Active Duty Total Force Integration unit, led The Airman's Creed.

Staff Sgt. (Retired) David Payne presented a plaque and a Vietnam Veterans Commemorative Flag to Brig. Gen. Paul Jacobs, Alabama's Assistant Adjutant General - Air, and Col. William Sparrow, Vice Commander, 187th Fighter Wing to honor those who served and paid the ultimate price.

As part of the ceremony, representatives spoke in memory of the six members of the 187th Fighter Wing family that were lost this past year. Retired Air National Guard Maj. Gen. Marvin S. "Scott" Mayes former commander of the 187th Fighter Wing delivered this year's keynote address.

"The people we are honoring today made me a better person. Most of the names that were added, I knew personally," said General Mayes. "They paved the way and it's up to us to keeping moving the Air Force forward."

The names of the six members honored during the ceremony were engraved onto a granite tablet, and added to list of 175 Dannelly Field members who have fallen over the years.



- 1. Promotion of the State Recruiting and Retention Superintendent (RRS) will require 9-skill level certification by the commander.
- Effective 1 April 2006, any member accessed into the ANG on or after this date must have 12 months TIG as an AIC (E-3) and 24 months TIS to be promoted to SrA (E-4).
- TIS computations for all promotions will be based on satisfactory years of service for retirement.
- 4. TIS is computed from the date the member enters IADT status. The source document for determining IADT is the TTS order or a completed DD Form 214
- 5. Only satisfactory years of service for retirement will be used to meet TIG requirements.
- 6. TIG is computed from the date the member enters IADT status. The source document for determining IADT is the TTS order or a completed DD Form 214.
- This requirement applies to ANG members enlisted from other branches of the Armed Forces, regardless of the level of PME attained during their prior service.
- 8. Completion of the United States Army Sergeants Major Academy or the United States Navy Senior Enlisted Academy is equivalent to SNCOA.
- Wounded Warrior (WW2) Classification: Although not world-wide qualified and not passing fitness based on their status, those members classified as WW2 are eligible for promotion provided they meet all other mandatory requirements including sole incumbency of a vacant position.

REMINDERS & NOTICES



IMPORTANT NOTICE



In accordance with the ALNG TAG'S Policy Letter dated 21 November 2013, Privately Owned Weapons (POWs) are allowed on ALNG installations. Members must adhere to the following to comply with the policy:

-POWs are **NOT** allowed until member receives a commander's brief,

-POWs are **NOT** allowed until member signs a statement of understanding,

-POWs are **NOT** allowed inside any building,

-POWs must be stored in a locked privately owned vehicle,

-Members must be eligible to carry a POW, according to all statutes and ordinances,

-Park in a valid designated area; (DANG defines a valid designated parking area as any legal POV parking space)

-Personnel will not use POWs under any circumstances to aid Security Forces

-POWs are **NOT** allowed on federal installations, i.e. Maxwell and Gunter AFB.

This is the TAG's policy and it's not negotiable.
